TOPIC: INDIAN SPORTS LEGENDS

Q1. Read the clues and name the sports legends of India.

- (i) She is regarded as one of the greatest athletes India has ever produced and is often called the "Queen of Indian track and field". She is nicknamed as the **Payyoli Express**.

- (ii) He is the three time winner of the World Amateur Billiards championship.

- (iii) He is also known as **The Flying Sikh**. He was the only Indian athlete to win an individual athletics gold medal at a Commonwealth Games till 2010.

- (iv) He was one of the greatest hockey players of his time. He was part of the Indian hockey team at three Olympic Games (1928, 1932 and 1936) and helped his team win gold in all three. He is popularly called the "Hockey Wizard".

- (v) He is a former Indian badminton player from Karnataka who won numerous laurels for his country in the field of badminton. He was awarded the Arjuna award in 1972 and the Padma Shri in 1982 by the government of India.

- (vi) He is a former Indian cricketer. He played Test cricket for the Indian cricket team, and later became an umpire on the elite International Cricket Council Test panel. His Test career was one of the longest for any Indian player.

- (vii) He won the Wimbledon junior title and the French Open junior title in 1979 and was ranked the No.1 junior player in the world.

- (viii) The greatest swimmer in India , he won a silver medal at the 1986 Asian Games.

- (ix) She is an Indian boxer and a five-time World Amateur Boxing champion, and the only woman boxer to have won a medal in each one of the six world championships. Nicknamed "Magnificent Mary", she is the only Indian woman boxer to have qualified for the 2012 Summer Olympics.

- (x) He captained the Indian cricket team which won the 1983 Cricket World Cup. Named by Wisden as the *Indian Cricketer of the Century* in 2002, he is one of the greatest all-rounders of all time.
